


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The map pictured above comes from the layout of the land in the 21st century, not from 3000 years ago. In the 20th century, it was common for commentaries to pinpoint the crossing of the red sea on the left side of the Sinai Peninsula, as exhibited in one commentary¹, but based on recent archeological evidence, including chariot wheels and land markers put there by Solomon indicating the exact location, the crossing most likely took place near the present Nuweibaa², raising another issue. How did 2-3 million Israelites, with some added trekking to throw off Pharaoh, cross the Sinai Peninsula in only three days? With the maps of Africa, particularly as it pertained to the region around the modern day Sinai Peninsula, having a different topography just 500 years ago³, the answer most likely lies in the layout of the land sporting a different topography in Moses' day, allowing for everything to come to fruition just as the text has it, without forcing any of the details in the account.
